The academic year 1996-97 has been a busy and challenging one for CSW, as we participated in Chancellor Dyne's review of the affirmative action committees and policies at UCSD. substantial report on our activities was submitted in June 1997, this report will be brief and directed primarily to an explanation of subcommittee activities. A budget request is enclosed and explained also.

From January to June 1997, CSW, its co-chairs and committee members generally, were involved in a process of self-review, pursuant to Chancellor Dynes' request. Confident of our value to the community in advancing gender equity and opportunities for campus women, we nonetheless expressed our frustration and reservations about discrete aspects of our affirmative action committee structure. All of this is explained at length in the report submitted to Chancellor Dynes.

This year we also carried out our usual annual activities: hosting the Chancellor's reception for new women faculty; running the women in science program; and organizing the Daycare Expo (under the Quality of Life SubCommittee). In addition we acted as host to the system-wide CSW meeting which was held here at the Faculty Club in late June. Yvonne Reid-Hairston organized that activity, including arranging a speaker and coordinating travel and hotel arrangements for more than twenty people. We also arranged for a speaker from the local office of the Federal Office for Contracts and Compliance Policies to address the issue of the Regents Resolutions and Proposition 209 in light of federal Civil Rights La. We finished with a reception at the Women's Center hosted by its director, Nancy Levinger.

Throughout the year CSW and the Women's Center director Worked to coordinate activities and to lay the basis of a productive future relationship. We co-sponsored speakers, including Senator Patricia Schroeder, we co-hosted receptions, and we collaborated in identifying issues of concern for women on campus.

In large measure as a result of the report to the Chancellor's Commission on Diversity, CSW was not able to pursue its main goal of the year: to investigate and compile data on the gender pattern appointment of faculty to key committees (ad-hocs, CAP, littee on Committee). Along with pay equity, about which Committee on Committee). Chancellor Dynes has indicated interest, this issue of access to power remains a key consideration in our monitoring of gender equity in faculty affairs.

For staff the key issues remains HRMI, and especially its effect on the base-building salary for women staff in the lowest job categories, as well as increasing access to staff education to enhance job mobility opportunities. All of these issues are discussed at more length in the CSW report to the Commission on Diversity.

Attached please find also the "Summary of Request for Funds" and the reports of individual Subcommittees.

DESCRIPTION:

The CSW/WISE subcommittee will continue to sponsor several events targeting issues of concern for women in science and engineering. CSW/WISE sponsors a number of functions each year, (brown bag lunches, beach barbecues, lectures, and receptions) designed to encourage campus networking between women faculty, postdocs and graduate students from School of Medicine, the Medical Center, Scripps, and the School of Engineering.

From the education reform movement of the 1960's and 1970's, which focused on equal educational opportunity for excluded groups, we already have learned a great deal about what works to improve the developmental and educational outcomes for students of color, low income and female students. CSW/WISE programs are designed to focus on addressing these barriers and to provide a forum, that articulate perspectives not otherwise represented on campus for WISE.

BENEFITS FOR WOMEN IN SCIENCE & ENGINEERING 2.

As stated in CSW year end report of 1996, "Women at UCSD are underrepresented in the fields of science." It is especially true at the postdoctoral and faculty levels. The committee has also determined that women in science tend to feel isolated because of this low representation. In the past years the committee on WISE has identified a series of specific issues of concern for female faculty, postdocs and graduate students, with the goal of organizing a series of meetings that would address these issues, and serve as a vehicle to get women in science together to discuss common problems and possible solutions.

The additional benefits would be identifying mentors, role models and self-empowerment. "Which would in turn allow the women to develop effective career plans and intervention strategies to achieve their goals."

SPEAKER/INSTRUCTION (include qualifications): 3.

Speakers will be chosen among the UC's faculty and researchers. WISE have identified programs such as: Gender harassment in male-oriented environments; Changing the "Chilly Climate" for women; History of Science; History of Women at SIO and speaker such as, Sheila Tobias, Sandra Harding (UCLA), Gina Sosinsky, Laura Smart and Jackie Parthmore.
